

## **Traveling by Car**

### **Driving Directions**

From the North - Follow I-95 South to Richmond, VA. Take I-64 East toward Norfolk/Virginia Beach, Va. Take I-64 or I-664 to Chesapeake, Va. From I-64, take Exit 291B to Route 168, the Chesapeake Expressway (this is a toll road which costs \$2 each way). Once in North Carolina, Route 168 turns into US-158 East. Follow this road to the Outer Banks. Once you have crossed over the bridge, stay in the left lane and turn north on Route 12.\*

From the West - Via I-95 into North Carolina. Take US-64 East toward Rocky Mount. Follow US-64 East through Williamston and Plymouth, NC. From Plymouth, NC keep going east to Roanoke Island and The Outer Banks. Once you've crossed over the bridge, US-64 turns into Route 158. Follow that north until just after mile marker 2. You will see a sign for Route 12. Take a right at the fork and follow Route 12 North.\*

### **From the Airport**

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#### **Driving on the beach -**

Off-road access is possible on the Outer Banks (and SO much fun) but only in designated areas. Use of a four-wheel-drive (4WD) vehicle is mandatory. You must let the air pressure out to prevent getting stuck in the sand or overheating your engine. The National Park Service says its rangers generally drive with 20-25 pounds of Pressure in their tires. Once on the beach, try to drive on the firm, wet sand below the high tide line and if there are previously made tracks, follow them. The speed limit on the beach is 25-35 miles per hour. Slow down when nearing pedestrians, they have the right of way. Drivers follow the same rules that apply on asphalt. Keep to the right; pass on the left, etc.

Watch out for wild horses. Don't pass too near of them while driving. They're an awesome sight to see, but they are wild; give them their space...
